General Purpose

The Summer Literacy Tutors are responsible for coordinating and delivering the Read It Program for elementary aged students. Read It is a free summer literacy program that provides one-on-one reading practice to children entering Grades 2-4 in September 2025. Sessions will be held in-person during July and August 2025.

Primary Responsibilities

Assist with the preparation of the literacy program.

Promote the program to area schools.

Organize registration of eligible students.

Organize tutoring schedule.

Tutor and monitor progress of students.

Record student achievements.

Prepare detailed evaluation of program at the end of summer.

Education/Experience

Candidates must be entering or currently enrolled in post-secondary education, preferably in an education-based program and have experience working with elementary school aged children.

Skills

Candidates should possess strong communication skills, both oral and written.

Candidates should also have a strong ability to organize, adhere to timelines, and work as part of a team as necessary.
